### ◆ STEPPING TO THE PLATE

Youngstown State will kick off the 2009 Horizon League Baseball Championship at 3 p.m. Tuesday with an elimination game against Butler. The tournament will be held at Cleveland State's home, The Pipe Yard, in Lorain, Ohio. Audio of all of YSU's games can be heard live on YSUsports.com.

If the No. 6 Penguins defeat the No. 7 Bulldogs, a team they went 4-1 against during the season, they will advance to play Wright State on Wednesday in the double-elimination format of the bracket.

YSU finished the regular season with a 16-34 overall mark, which included a 10-14 ledger in league games. The Penguins enter the tournament having won two straight games behind a strong offense. YSU is batting .330 with 11 home runs in May, which is a big improvement over its .264 average in April.

First-Team All-Horizon League pitcher Phil Klein will take the mound against Butler, and 2008 Horizon League Pitcher of the Year Aaron Swenson will follow if the Penguins advance. Jacke Healey joined Klein in earning first-team all-league, and David Leon and Eric Marzec were named second-team.

### ◆ RIGHT OFF THE BAT

- YSU is 7-5 as the lower seed and 1-7 as the higher seed all-time in Horizon League Tournament games.
- YSU had a team ERA of 4.74 in Horizon League games, but it was four runs higher at 8.87 in non-league games during the regular season.
- Of YSU's 14 Horizon League losses, seven were by one run and one was by two. Five of the seven one-run losses came in the last at bat.
- Aaron Swenson and Corey Vukovic are the only YSU pitchers who have previously appeared in the Horizon League Tournament.
- YSU has hit 11 home runs in 10 games this month.

## HITTERS TO WATCH

**4 DAVID LEON | SO. | IF --** Named Second-Team All-Horizon League at second base... enters the tournament batting .283 with 24 runs scored, a homer, 15 RBIs and five steals... has hits in 10 of his last 12 games, including four straight... is batting .419 (18-for-43) over the last 10 games... had a career-high four hits and scored a career-best three runs against Buffalo on May 13... six of his 12 multi-hit games have come since April 29... had hits in nine of 11 games from March 20 to April 5... was batting .309 on April 5 but hit a 2-for-35 slide to drop his average to .233 on April 26... also hit safely in nine of the first 11 games... has converted on 219 of his 227 chances in his first season at second base for a .965 fielding pct.

**5 ERIC HYMEL | JR. | OF --** Has started 28 games and played in 41... hit .297 (11-for-37) in April after entering the month with a .191 average... batting .228 with 13 runs scored, three steals and 11 RBIs... has scored four runs in the last two games... drove in the winning run in the 10th at Butler (4/26)... also drove in the go-ahead run in the eighth against Toledo (5/12)... had three RBIs at VMI (2/27)... in his first season at YSU after transferring from Southwest Mississippi CC where he hit .385 as a sophomore.

**10 JACKE HEALEY | JR. | IF --** First-Team All-Horizon League at shortstop... first all-conference SS in YSU history... batting .301 with team highs in runs scored (37), RBIs (36), homers (8) and doubles (17)... has 12 multi-RBI games and 16 multi-hit games... hitting .377 with runners in scoring position and .391 after the fifth inning... ranks fourth in the Horizon League in doubles, fifth in homers, seventh in runs scored, seventh in RBIs and eighth in slugging (.536)... went 5-for-9 with a homer, two doubles, four runs scored and five RBIs in his last two games... named the Horizon League Player of the Week on March 2 after giving YSU the lead in the ninth on back-to-back-days at VMI... on an eight-game hitting streak... homered on back-to-back days at Valpo (5/1-2)... got off to a torrid start, batting .425 with eight doubles in the first 11 games... named to the NJCAA All-America second team last season at Potomac State after hitting .456 with 11 homers.

**11 C.J. MORRIS | JR. | IF --** Batting .282 with 23 runs scored, two homers and 21 RBIs... has started 44 games - 41 at third base and one at short - and played in every game... has matched his career high with three hits four times... hit a three-run homer, his second of the season, against Wright State (5/8)... had two hits in three out of four games from May 2-9... went 3-for-4 with a double, two RBIs and a run scored against Butler... hit safely in 12 of the first 14 games, including the first 10.

**17 JEREMY BANKS | FR. | 1B --** Batting .281 with 28 runs scored, four homers and 29 RBIs... hitting .324 with a team-high 15 RBIs against Horizon League opponents... has hit safely in 10 straight games and in 13 of the last 14... hitting .389 with three home runs, 12 runs scored and a team-high 17 RBIs over the last 10 games... homered three times in a four-game span from May 2-8, including both games of a doubleheader on May 8 against Wright State... hit a three-run homer and matched a career-high four RBIs at Valpo (5/2)... also drove in four against Buffalo (5/13)... scored a career-high three runs at Valpo (5/2)... hit a walk-off, game-winning single in the bottom of the ninth against Cleveland State (4/11)... scored the winning run in the seventh at Marshall (3/15).

**18 JOE IACOBUCCI | SO. | OF --** Batting .279 with 20 runs and 19 RBIs... hitting .293 against HL opponents... has hit .305 and posted 18 of his 19 RBIs since March 17, boosting his average from .136... has hit in five straight games and has an RBI in four of the last five... went 3-for-5 and scored the winning run in the 10th at Butler (4/26)... went 3-for-4 with a run scored and doubled against Toledo (5/12)... had three hits and homered at Akron (3/18)... Second-Team All-Horizon in 2008, leading YSU in batting average (.369) and RBIs (33).

**20 JASON REITENBACH | SO. | OF --** Has started eight games and played in 27... appeared eight times as a pinch runner... has scored 11 times in 11 different games... scored the tying run vs. Milwaukee in the ninth (4/18)... batted .259 in 37 games last season.

**22 TOM CLAYTON | JR. | OF --** Has appeared in 25 games, 23 of which he's come off the bench... scored the go-ahead run against Toledo in the eighth inning (5/12)... made his first start since opening day at Valpo on May 2, going 0-for-4... his nine previous at bats were as a pinch hitter... his last hit was a pinch-hit single at UIC on March 27... was 8-for-19 (.421) with seven RBIs in 17 games as a sub in 2008.

**24 ANTHONY PORTER | JR. | C --** Batting .305 with 15 runs scored, three homers and 23 RBIs... average is at a season-high... has hit safely in 11 of his last 12 games, and six have been multi-hit games... has 11 RBIs in the span... hit his third homer and drove in two runs vs. Buffalo (5/13)... has started 34 games and played in 41... went 2-for-3 with a three-run homer vs. Kent State (4/22)... hit three doubles in three games from April 5-14... has 12 two-hit games and a three-hit game... homered and had two RBIs at Towson (3/7).

**33 JONATHAN CRIST | FR. | C --** Hitting .294 with six runs scored, seven RBIs and a homer... his homer came on a rare inside-the-park grand slam on May 2 at Valparaiso... had a career-high three hits at Butler (4/26)... doubled in a run at Toledo (5/12)... went 1-for-3 and scored vs. Buffalo (5/13).

**35 GREG DISSINGER | SO. | 1B --** Batted .389 in Horizon League games and .218 overall... has not played since April 14 because of being sick with mono... had his first three-hit game vs. Butler (4/4)... also had two hits the previous game at UIC (3/27)... earned All-Region X honors last year at Lenoir CC when he batted .431 with 29 RBIs and four homers.

**36 CASEY HOLLAND | JR. | C --** Batting .248 with three home runs, 16 RBIs and 13 runs scored... drove in seven runs in six games from April 18-27, including two on a game-winning double vs. Milwaukee (4/18)... had his first three-hit game and drove in a career-high four runs vs. UWM... has started 30 games - seven at third base - and played in 42... had a nine game hitting streak from March 8-20 to boost his average from .133 to .319... homered twice in a four-game span from March 20-24.

## PITCHING PROBABLES

**31 PHIL KLEIN | SO. | RHP** -- First-Team All-Horizon League pitcher... has pitched in 16 games - 10 as a starter and six as a reliever... is 5-1 with a save and a 4.19 ERA... went 4-0 with a 3.83 ERA against Horizon League opponents... struck out 61 in 56.1 innings in conference games and 76 in 73.0 overall... has struck out 34 in his last 26 innings, and his 9.4 strikeouts per nine innings leads the league... has earned the win each of the last three times he's taken the mound... threw 3.2 innings of scoreless relief to beat Buffalo (5/13)... struck out a career-high 12 in his last start against Valpo, allowing two runs on two hits in seven innings (5/9)... allowed four runs on six hits in 6.2 innings while striking out 10 against Valpo the week before (5/2)... has gone at least six innings in each of his last seven starts... did not earn a win until April 5, which came against Butler... held the Bulldogs to one run on six hits in six innings... also pitched against Butler on April 26 but did not factor in the decision... allowed two runs on five hits in the first seven innings... threw a career-long 8.2 innings and left with a 5-3 lead, but both of his runners scored on a two-out triple and removed him from the decision... threw seven scoreless innings and allowed five hits in a combined 1-0 shutout against Cleveland State (4/12)... was named the Horizon League Scholar-Athlete of the Week for his efforts on the mound and his 3.81 GPA in finance... was also the Horizon League Scholar-Athlete of the Month for April... has a 1.00 ERA in nine innings out of the bullpen... was 1-1 with a 11.09 ERA last season... threw a seven-inning perfect game in the Atlantic Collegiate Baseball League over the summer for the Hampton Whalers... it was the league's first perfect game since 1977.

**8 TRENT WOOD | JR. | RHP** -- Is 2-2 with a 7.08 ERA in 20 appearances, 18 of which have been in relief... has allowed one earned run in 11 innings as a starter... did not allow an earned run in six innings in his first start against Marshall on April 29... allowed one earned run in five innings against Toledo on May 12... has struck out 15 and walked five in his last seven appearances after walking 20 and striking out 14 in his first 13... did not allow an earned run in a 10.2-inning span from April 22-May 2, which dropped his ERA from 10.89 to 6.98... picked up his two wins on back-to-back days at VMI on Feb. 27-28... allowed a run in one inning against the Keydets on Feb. 27... threw three scoreless innings and struck out a career-high five the next day... compiled a 1.96 ERA and struck out 35 in 36 innings last season at Marshalltown CC in Iowa.

**14 JIM KINNICK | FR. | RHP** -- Is 2-1 with a 5.62 ERA in eight appearances, seven of which have been out of the bullpen... has not allowed a run in his last 5.1 innings, and it's been almost a month since he allowed an earned run... last earned run allowed came on April 22 against Kent State in his lone start... allowed seven runs, five of which were earned, on six hits and three walks in two innings... has thrown 9.1 innings since, striking out six and allowing three hits... threw 3.1 scoreless innings of relief against Marshall to earn his first win in what was YSU's 2,000th game as a program... also got the win in relief against Toledo by throwing two scoreless innings (5/12)... held Valparaiso scoreless in 3.1 innings, allowing two hits and three walks while striking out a career-high four (5/9)... was the Youngstown Class B Summer League ERA Champion in 2007 when he went 4-1 with four shutouts, 40 strikeouts and two earned runs in 33 innings... was rated as the 87th-best player in the 2008 Ohio graduating class by The Buckeye Scout.

**2 ANTHONY MUNOZ | JR. | RHP** -- Has pitched in a team-high 26 contests, all of which have been in relief... is 1-5 with one save and a 5.72 ERA... has not been scored upon in any of his last six outings, which has spanned 6.2 innings... has struck out seven batters and allowed four hits in that span... has walked 18 and struck out 25 in 39.1 innings... has struck out seven since his last walk... earned his first win at Butler on April 26, striking out the side in the 10th... is in his first season as a pitcher as a converted infielder... earned his save by throwing a scoreless inning at VMI (2/27)... all four of his losses have come in one-run contests.

**6 ERIC MARZEC | JR. | RHP** -- Second-Team All-Horizon League as a utility player for the second straight year... has pitched in 10 games, nine of which have been out of the bullpen... an injury to his glove hand has kept him off the mound since April 18... has a 2.40 ERA with two saves in 15.0 relief innings... overall, is 1-4 with a 5.29 ERA... has walked six and struck out 20 in 17 innings... all three of his losses out of the bullpen have been in one-run games... picked up saves against Butler (4/5) and Cleveland State (4/12)... struck out three and retired all six batters he faced against Cleveland State... struck out a season-high five in 3.1 innings at Wright State (3/21)... was 2-1 with two saves and a 2.82 ERA last season.

## KLEIN, HEALEY EARN FIRST-TEAM HORIZON LEAGUE HONORS

Sophomore pitcher Phil Klein and junior shortstop Jacke Healey have been voted 2009 First-Team All-Horizon League by the league's coaches.

Second baseman David Leon and utility player Eric Marzec earned second-team accolades, and Healey was honored on the all-newcomer team. Klein, Healey and Leon are first-time honorees, and Marzec was named to the second team for the second straight season.

Klein has been perhaps the Horizon League's most-improved player on his way to earning first-team honors. The sophomore right-hander went 5-1 with a 4.19 ERA, and he struck out 76 batters in 73 innings during the regular season. He was even better in league contests, posting a 4-0 record, a 3.83 ERA and 61 strikeouts in 56.1 innings. His 9.4 strikeouts per nine innings led all starting pitchers. Last season, Klein was 1-1 with a 11.09 ERA and pitched in just 18.2 innings.

Healey hit a team-high eight home runs during the regular season, and he also led the Penguins in runs scored, RBIs, doubles, slugging percentage and total bases. He batted .377 with runners in scoring position, and he was strong defensively with a .951 fielding percentage. Healey is also the first shortstop in school history to be named first-team all-conference. He is in his first year at YSU as a transfer from Potomac State College.

Leon closed out the regular season on a hot streak to earn the second-team nod. He hit safely in 10 of the final 12 games and batted .419 over the span. He finished the season with a .283 average, 24 runs scored, 15 RBIs, five steals and a .965 fielding percentage.

Marzec was the second-team utility man for the second straight season despite an injury keeping out of every game since April 18. On that date, Marzec was leading the Penguins in triples, home runs and slugging percentage. On the mound, Marzec had two saves, a 2.40 ERA and 18 strikeouts in 15 innings out of the bullpen.

## SWENSON, KLEIN FORM STRONG STRIKEOUT DUO

Youngstown State starting pitchers Aaron Swenson and Phil Klein have formed one of the best strikeout duos in school history. Swenson struck out his 70th batter against Buffalo on May 13, and Klein has struck out 76. This is the second time in YSU history that two pitchers have fanned at least 70 batters in the same season. Bill Sattler (89) and Dave Dravecky (77) did it in 1977. Both of those players went on to get selected in the Major League Baseball draft. Dravecky was a National League All-Star in 1983 and pitched in the 1984 World Series.

## KLEIN K'S 12 IN LAST START VS. VALPO

Phil Klein will come into the Horizon League Tournament with some major momentum. In his last start against Valparaiso on May 9, he struck out a career-high 12 batters in seven innings. That

was the highest single-game total since Justin Thomas fanned 15 Cleveland State batters on April 10, 2005. Over his last 26 innings, Klein has struck out 34 batters.

## TEAM BATTING AVG AT HIGHEST POINT

YSU has its batting average up to a season-high .278 entering the Horizon League Tournament. The Penguins have hit .330 over their last 13 games to bring their average up from .259 on April 26. In the last 13 games, YSU has posted 10 hits or more eight times and has not had fewer than eight in a game that has not been shortened by weather.

## MAY NOTHING LIKE APRIL AT THE PLATE

The Penguins have really stepped it up offensively in their first 10 games in May. The Penguins are batting .330 this month and have scored 78 runs in the 10 games. The Penguins have 17 doubles, three triples and 11 homers.

By comparison, YSU had a cold April at the plate. The Penguins hit .264 with 77 runs scored, 23 doubles and three homers.

## HEALEY'S BAT RARE FOR SHORTSTOPS

Junior Jacke Healey has made a strong case to be recognized as the top offensive shortstop in YSU history in just one season. His eight home runs are the most ever by a YSU shortstop, and he is the first shortstop in school history to be named first-team all-conference.

Healey leads YSU in homers, runs scored, RBIs, doubles, slugging percentage and total bases. He batted .377 with runners in scoring position, and he was strong defensively with a .951 fielding percentage. Healey, also an all-newcomer team pick, is in his first year at YSU as a transfer from Potomac State College.

## TREND OF YSU AND CLEVELAND STATE ELIMINATING EACH OTHER

Cleveland State and Youngstown State have always been rivals due to their close proximity, but that has carried out onto the field in recent years. The teams have eliminated each other from the Horizon League Tournament in four of the last five years. That trend started when YSU defeated Cleveland State in the tournament championship game in 2004. Last season, Cleveland State ousted YSU from the tournament at Eastwood Field with a 10-4 victory.

## RECENT TOURNAMENTS IN OHIO HAVE BEEN UNFRIENDLY

Since Youngstown State won the Horizon League Tournament at Eastwood Field, the Guins have not had any postseason success in the Buckeye state. YSU has gone 0-4 in tournament games since its 2004 run - 0-2 in 2006 at Wright State and 0-2 last season at Eastwood Field.

## BACK-TO-BACK FIRST-TEAM PITCHERS

With Phil Klein earning first-team all-league mentioning, the Penguins have had a first-team all-conference pitcher in back-to-back seasons for the second time in school history. Aaron Swenson was the Horizon League Pitcher of the Year and first-team all-league last season. Shane Mead (1997) and Gary Gubanich (1996) earned first-team all-league nods previously in back-to-back seasons. Gubanich's last season was 1996, so this is the first time in school history that YSU has had two first-team all-conference pitchers on its roster at the same time.

## PENGUINS WELCOME MARZEC, DISSINGER BACK TO LINEUP

The Penguins will get a lift with the return of Eric Marzec and Greg Dissinger for the Horizon League Tournament. Marzec had a cast removed from his glove hand on Thursday, and he will be eligible to pitch this week. He has not played since April 18 because of a broken bone in his hand that he suffered from being hit with a pitch. Marzec had two saves, a 2.40 ERA and 18 strikeouts in 15 innings out of the bullpen before his injury. He was also leading the Penguins in triples (3), homers (5) and slugging (.524), but he will more than likely remain out of the batting order.

Dissinger has been limited to playing in 22 games with an ankle injury early in the season and a recent bout of mono. He got off to a hot start in Horizon League play with seven hits in 18 at bats, but he has not played since April 14 because of a bout with mono.

## BANKS STRONG TO END TO FIRST YEAR

Freshman Jeremy Banks has hit safely in 13 of the final 14 games this season and in 10 straight. Over the last 10 games, he is batting .389 with three home runs, 12 runs scored and a team-high 17 RBIs. In his first 34 games he had 16 runs, one homer and 12 RBIs.

Banks hit .281 with 28 runs scored, four home runs and 29 RBIs during the regular season. His .392 on base percentage ranked second on the team. He was even better against Horizon League opponents, posting a .324 average and .415 OBP.

## SLOW STARTS WERE A PROBLEM EARLY

Youngstown State found itself in an early hole in many games this season, especially in non-conference contests. The Penguins were outscored by 85 runs (223-138) or 1.7 runs per game in the first five innings. In their 24 Horizon League games, the margin was just 76-69. YSU was outscoring its opponents in the first five innings of league games before Wright State held a 19-9 advantage in the doubleheader on May 8.

A big contributor to the scoring margin has been opposing teams' batting average in the third through fifth innings. During the regular season, opponents batted .356 in the third inning, .353 in the fourth and .352 in the fifth.

## KINNICK, MUNOZ HAVE BEEN SOLID OUT OF THE BULLPEN

Anthony Munoz and Jim Kinnick both enter the Horizon League Tournament with impressive scoreless streaks. Munoz has not been scored upon in any of his last six outings, which has spanned 6.2 innings. He has struck out seven batters and allowed four hits in that span. Kinnick has not allowed a run in his last 5.1 innings, and it's been almost a month since he allowed an earned run. His last earned run came on April 22 against Kent State. Since then he's thrown 9.1 innings, allowing one run on three hits while striking out six.

## HEALEY'S BEEN CLUTCH LATE

Jacke Healey has been at his best in the late innings this season. After the fifth inning, he is batting .391 with, five home runs, 23 RBIs, 21 runs scored and a .884 slugging percentage. Overall, Healey is batting .377 with runners in scoring position and has 14 two-out RBIs. His 12 multi-RBI games are also a team-high.

## GUINS PERFECT ON THEFTS IN FINAL TWO WEEKS

The Penguins were a perfect 9-for-9 in the final two weeks of the regular season, and they have not been caught in their last 12 attempts. During that span, Jacke Healey and John Koehnlein went 3-for-3, Jeremy Banks and C.J. Morris went 2-for-2, and Derek Carr and David Leon went 1-for-1.

Since April 12, YSU has stolen 27 bases in 21 games. The Penguins have been caught just four times in that span. Prior to April 12, YSU had 22 steals in 29 games but had been caught 16 times.

## HEALEY PUTTING TOGETHER SOLID SEASON

Jacke Healey has hit eight home runs and 17 doubles, both of which are team-highs, in his first season since arriving from Potomac State. The totals put him in rare company in the Penguins' recent history. He joins Mark Thomas (1999) as the only players in school history to have at least eight home runs and 17 doubles in the same season. Thomas, a 21st round pick by the Montreal Expos, hit nine home runs and 22 doubles in 1999.

## LONG ROAD FOR TOURNEY TITLE RUN

If the Penguins want to win the Horizon League Championship, they will have to win at least five games this week. Last year's No. 6 seed, Valparaiso, worked its way up to a third-place finish last season by going 3-2. One of those wins came against Youngstown State. Last season was the first for the play-in game format. No sixth-seeded team has ever won the league title.

## UP NEXT: WRIGHT STATE

If YSU advances past Butler, it will play No. 3 Wright State on Wednesday at 3 p.m. That game will be part of the double-elimination format.

## EARLIER IN 2009 VS. BUTLER

### April 4 in Niles, Ohio • YSU 6, Butler 1

Starter Aaron Swenson earned his third straight complete-game victory over the Butler as YSU won game one of a doubleheader, 6-1.

Swenson allowed just five hits and matched his career high with 10 strikeouts. He did not allow a hit and struck out nine through five innings. Greg Dissinger and John Koehnlein had three hits as YSU had 13 as a team. YSU scored all of its runs in the third, fourth and fifth.

### April 4 in Niles, Ohio • YSU 12, Butler 2

Starter Cody Dearth picked up where Swenson left off, holding Butler to two runs on six hits in his first career complete game as YSU won 12-2. He did not allow a hit from the fifth through eighth innings.

Derek Carr had two hits and three RBIs, two of which came in the sixth when YSU blew the game open with five runs. Eric Marzec, C.J. Morris and Joe Iacobucci had three hits apiece. Marzec also drove in four in scored three times.

### April 5 in Niles, Ohio • YSU 8, Butler 4

Phil Klein allowed one run in six innings, and YSU scored six of its eight runs with two outs in an 8-4 victory over Butler that completed a three-game sweep.

As a staff, the Penguins allowed three earned runs in 27 innings against the Bulldogs over the weekend. Butler took its only lead of the weekend, 1-0 in the first, before YSU scored three in the second.

Jeremy Banks and Anthony Porter both had two hits and two RBIs for YSU, which committed just one error in the three-game set.

### April 26 in Indianapolis • Butler 4, YSU 1

YSU stranded 11 runners and went 2-for-19 with runners in scoring position in a 4-1 loss to Butler. Aaron Swenson went the distance on the mound, allowing the four runs on seven hits and four walks in eight innings.

Butler's first run came on a wild pitch in the first, and Grant Fillipitch gave the Bulldogs a 3-0 lead with a two-run homer in the third.

Derek Carr drove in David Leon in the fifth on a fielder's choice in the fifth for YSU's lone run. The Penguins stranded five runners in the final two innings.

Phil Klein had his longest outing of the year but gave up five runs in 8.2 innings.

### April 26 in Indianapolis • YSU 6, Butler 5

Eric Hymel hit an RBI single in the top of the 10th inning as YSU staved off Butler's comeback and salvaged a doubleheader split.
